Assistant Professor of Animal Welfare Epidemiology

The University of California at Davis is pleased to announce the recruitment for a tenure-track faculty position in Animal Welfare Epidemiology. The successful candidate will join the Department of Animal Science in the College of Agricultural and Environmental Sciences at the rank of Assistant Professor. Criteria for appointment include: a Ph.D. or equivalent in epidemiology, animal science or animal ethology, a record of excellence in scholarly research, and demonstrable potential to establish a competitively-funded research program. The appointee will be responsible for teaching two annual undergraduate upper division courses on 1) animal health “ANS 150 Animal Health and Disease” and 2) statistics to meet the teaching needs of the departmental curriculum as well as a graduate course taught every other year. The appointee is expected to be actively involved in undergraduate advising, curricular development and department and university service. The appointee is also expected to guide and mentor graduate students and participate in research and outreach/engagement programs consistent with the mission of the CA Agricultural Experiment Station.
