Abstracts should not exceed 350 words. Format the body of the abstract with one-inch margins using Arial 10-point font. Center and bold the title. Center the name of the author(s) below the title with initials followed by last name. The location of author(s) should be placed directly below the author(s) name. Superscript numbers may be used to designate different locations for authors. Abstract should be accurate and complete, and will be considered final upon submission. Send your abstract as an e-mail attachment (MS Word compatible file) to Dr. Kerry A. Rood (kerry.rood@usu.edu).

Please submit proposals by July 1, 2017. Authors of selected abstracts will be notified by August 1, 2017. Presenters will be given 15-20 minutes to summarize a project that highlights animal or public health topics applicable to an audience of veterinarians and animal health professionals involved in extension, regulatory, academia, and diagnostics. There will be 5 minutes allowed for Q&A.

Students: Travel grants of up to \$500 per applicant will be provided by the AAEV for eligible students. This amount is intended to help cover travel expenses (transportation, lodging, food, etc.) incurred to attend and present at the Applied Animal and Public Health Research and Extension Symposium. Travel grant awardees will be selected based upon their area of research in applied animal and public health as well as the completeness of their application. Up to 2 awards will be granted per year.
